CROWN LAND OFFICE.

Fredericton, 6th Aug. 1832.

Sir,—For the information of His Ex-
cellency the Lieutenant Governor, I have
to request that you will immediately fur-
nish me with a list of the number of per-
sons within the District assigned to your
charge, who have, without proper author-
ity, taken possession of certain portions
of Crown Land, and made improvements
thereon.

In framing your Report you will state
the extent and value of the improvements
made by the parties, the number and
value of their Stock, and also their ability
to purchase from the Crown such a quantity
of land, comprising their clearances, as
may be sufficient to make them a farm, it
being the intention of the Lieutenant Go-
vernor to deal leniently with those persons
who shall, after being notified, make im-
mediate application to purchase the land
on which they may reside.

You may at the same time inform all
persons so situated that in default of im-
mediate application being made for per-
mission to purchase the lands in question,
the Attorney General will be directed to
proceed against them according to Law.
