His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Honorable Thomas Baillie, Commissioner of Crown Lands, and JOHN SIMCOE SAUNDERS, Esquire, to be Commissioners for managing and superintending the sale, levying and collecting of the Quit Rents, and for carrying into effect His Majesty's Instructions in that behalf; and WILLIAM F. ODELL, Esquire, to be Secretary to the said Commissioners.

His Majesty's Government having determined to collect the Quit Rents on the Granted Lands in this Province—Notice is hereby given, by order of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, that His Majesty is graciously pleased to remit all Quit Rents due previously to Midsummer day last, but that they will be strictly enforced from that period.

With the view, however, of giving every encouragement to Persons desirous of commencing them, they will be permitted to redeem them on the following Terms: At Sixteen Years purchase to all Persons who may redeem them before Midsummer day 1833.

At Eighteen Years purchase to those Persons who may redeem them subsequently to that period, and anterior to Midsummer 1834.

And at Twenty Years purchase, to those Persons who may commute them subsequently to Midsummer 1836, with an intimation, however, that His Majesty's Government will then take into consideration how far it may be expedient to dispose of the undredeemed Quit Rents to any Persons desirous of purchasing them on the principle adopted in England with regard to the Land Tax.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Honorable Thomas Baillie, Commissioner of Crown Lands, and JOHN SIMCOE SAUNDERS, Esquire, to be Commissioners for managing and superintending the Sale, Levying and Collecting of the Quit Rents, and for that purpose to carry into effect the above Regulations—PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that all Applications relating to the Sale or Redemption of the Quit Rents must be addressed to the above named Commissioners, and lodged at the Office of the Subscriber, by whom they will be submitted to the Commissioners; whose Report thereon will be laid before His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor for his decision: and all Persons concerned are hereby notified that His Majesty's Instructions for the collection of all Quit Rents, not redeemed, are immediately to be carried into full effect.

IN THE YORK GENERAL SESSIONS.

JUNE TERM, 1832.

IT IS ORDERED

By the Court, that from and after the passing of this Regulation, There shall be a PROMENADE and WALK upon each side of every Street in the Town Plat of Fredericton, extending from the Outer Lines of the said Streets, or from the Houses or Buildings erected thereon, into or towards the centre of the said Streets, fourteen feet; and that no Palings, Porches or Cellar ways shall be erected, placed or dug thereon, extending more than Six Feet from the said Outer Lines or Buildings, into or upon the said Promenade or Walk; and that no person or persons shall place and continue thereon any obstructions whatever, or shall ride, or drive thereon any Horse, or Horses, or other Cattle, or any Cart, Wagon, or Carriage, whatever, under the penalty of Twenty Shillings for each and every offence, to be recovered and applied as directed in and by the Act of the General Assembly, 50 Geo. 3. Chapter 18.

IT IS ORDERED, that no Horse, Horses or Swine shall be suffered to run at large upon any Public Street or Highway within the County of York; And it shall be the duty of all Horsekeepers forthwith to take up and impound all Horses and Swine found going at large upon any public Street or Highway, contrary to this Regulation, who shall be entitled to receive two Shillings and six pence for each animal so taken up and impounded, to be collected by the Poundkeeper, together with the Charges, from the owner, or owners, before such Horses or Swine shall be delivered from the Pound.
