We observe that Sir Andrew threatens to introduce the measure in another form, and if it be less extensive in its character, and more temperate in its provisions, it may probably reach a Committee of the House for revisal.

Alexandria, April 17 .- Peace is concluded. The Porte accepts the terms offered by the Viceroy, who has conceded to him Syria and Adana, as tar as the limits of Taurus, and the Egyptian army is on its March back to Egypt. It would be difficult to express the satisfation which this has spread through the Country at the very moment that the intervention of the diplomacy of all Europe seemed to present no prospect but a series of inefficient protocols. Mehemet Ali himself, on receiving this intelligence from the mouth of one of his son's officers, was so affected that he wept with joy .-Turkish gravity could not restrain the expression of his satisfaction, which exhibited itself by grasping the hands and addressing abrupt sentences to a crowd of Europeans who hastened to congratulate the happy old man on the last trophy, perhaps, of a long life of triumphs. Portuguese affairs seem to be assuming a

character of activity. The inaction of the contending parties is about to cease, and Pedro is said to be making extensive preparations for offensive measures.
