The following CIRCULAR LETTER, has been issued from the Attorney General's Office, to the different High Sheriffs of Counties in the Province, for the purpose of obtaining information to enable him to prepare the draft of a Bill to be laid before the General Assembly, relating to lands bounded on the Banks of Rivers, and other Waters in the Province, pursuant to instructions from the Colonial Office, to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor on that subject.

ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE, Fredericton, 2d Nov. 1833.

Sir, I HAVE received the command of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Instructions from His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonial Department, to prepare the draft of a Bill to be laid before the General Assembly, to quiet the apprehensions of Proprietors of land on the Banks of Rivers or other Waters in this Province; I have to request, you will make Public to the owners of Lands so situated within your County, that I shall be ready to receive any communications from them, as to the relative situations of their respective Water fronts, and the extent and nature of the desired accommodation.
