BOARD OF HEALTH.

At a Meeting of the Board of Health for the
County of York, held at the County Court
House, on Monday the 8th September, 1834.

WHEREAS in consequence of the Asiatic
Cholera prevailing in Halifax and Que-
bec, and whereas it is considered highly ne-
cessary and proper by the Board that precau-
tionary measures should be taken to examine,
purify, and fumigate all such Persons who may
have left, or who may hereafter leave Halifax,
Quebec, or any other place, infected with
Cholera, and intend to come to this Town, to-
gether with their Clothes and Baggage of every
description, at some distance from the Town,
before they are allowed to enter therein:

Therefore Resolved, That all Persons com-
ing from Halifax, Quebec, or any other place
infected with Cholera, be required, previous to
entering within the limits of the Parish of Fre-
dericton, or between Philips' Creek and the Short
Ferry, to report himself or themselves to the
Chairman, or some other Member of the Board
of Health for the County of York, and obtain-
ing leave from the same: And any Person or
Persons disobeying this Order, from and after
the 15th day of September instant, the Legal
Penalty of **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS** will be
rigidly enforced.

siness thereof in his own person, will be ap-

all sums which may become due in respect
of the said Canteen, and for the due perform-

This number will be ascertained from the
Barrack Master's monthly returns, which
are made up on the 1st day of every month;
and no changes in the occupation of the bar-
racks which may take place in the progress
of the month, either for or against the Ten-
ant, will be taken into account. No less
number than ten will be charged against the
Tenant, nor will any odd number be calcu-
lated: thus, if the barracks should be occu-
