The awful situation of those on board, at this period, can better be imagined than described. - In a few minutes, her foremast went by the board, and soon after, the mainmast, and in the course of half an hour, the hull of the vessel was literally stove to pie-

The names of the persons saved, are Peof Sussex Vale, New Brunswick, passengers; John Boole, John Kircus, and George Stowell, seamen; and the stewardess, a colored girl.

Mr. Goulding and the colored girl, saved themselves by clinging to a piece of the quarter deck which was washed upon the rocks. Mr.G. was so much bruised as to be unable to walk when he got on shore. One of the sailors got into the boat at the davits with the mate and one passenger for the purpose of saving themselves, but the mate and passenger, thinking there would be no chance of escape that way, got on board again. leaving the sailor in the boat, who was soon washed out, and finally washed on shore sale. The other two sailors and one passenger saved themselves by jumping from the bows of the vessel upon the rocks, as the sea left them bare, and as the sea came upon them they held last to the rocks until it again receded, when they would crawl as far as they could, before another sea came upon them and in this way they finally succeeded in reaching the shore above the break of the sea.
