HAMILTON, BERMUDA, Thursday,

January 23, 1834.

We hasten to lay before the Public the fol-

lowing most important Resolution, moved in

the Honorable the House of Assembly yester-

day:—

The Committee of the whole House, having

taken into consideration the various Documents

laid before the House by His Excellency the

Governor relative to Slavery, are of opinion

that it is fit and proper in consideration of the

compensation provided by the aforesaid Statute,

that unrestricted freedom of the Slaves of

this Colony, take place on the first day of Au-

gust next.

Resolved, Therefore, that Slavery be abo-

lished within this colony, on the first day of

August next, and that the Apprenticeship sys-

tem, contemplated by the said Statute, be dis-

posed with, so far as regards the Island of

Bermuda.

By the recent arrivals from Trinidad, ac-

counts have been received of a rising among

the Slaves in the French Island of Martinique;

that the Governor at the head of 3,000 men

had proceeded against the insurgents, and had

captured 84 leaders or most active of them, on

whom, little doubt appeared to be entertained,

the just punishment of their temerity, death

would be awarded. Tranquillity was not fully

restored at the date of the latest advices there.
