FREDERICTON, June 28, 1834.

At the Annual Meeting of the College Council on Tuesday last, the thanks of the Council were ordered to be presented to the Rev. Dr. Jacob for his Anniversary Sermon, preached before the University.

The Council regretted their inability to confirm the award of the Douglas Gold Medal, in consequence of the absence of the requisite competition for the prize; but directed the sum of Ten Pounds to be presented to Mr. George Lee, in testimony of the intrinsic merit of his Essay on "The Practical Value of Natural Philosophy."

The Silver Medal is awarded to Mr. William Shore, whose proficiency was considered the most satisfactory at the Examination of the Collegiate School.

In his Eulogical Oration the Venerable Archdeacon Coster paid a just tribute to the memory of the late Honorable John Saunders, D. C. L., of this University, for his zealous and steady support of its interests, and valuable services as a member of the College Council.

"The Moral Philosophy of Aristotle compared with that of Cicero," is the subject of the Essay for the Gold Medal of the ensuing year; which commences on the first Thursday in September next.
