### A PROCLAMATION.

IN consideration of the danger to be apprehended to this Province, from the progress of a grievous Disease with which the neighbouring Provinces, and many other parts of the world, are visited, I have thought fit, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Council hereby to order and direct, that on Wednesday, the Eighth day of October next, a PUBLIC FAST and HUMILIATION be observed throughout this Province, that so we may humble ourselves before Almighty God, and in the most devout and solemn manner, send up our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty for averting those heavy judgments which our manifold provocations have most justly deserved, and particularly beseeching God to remove that grievous Disease, and in his mercy to preserve us from its visitation: and I do hereby strictly charge and command that the said Public Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all His Majesty's loving subjects in this Province, as they tender the favor of Almighty God, and would avoid his wrath and indignation.

And Whereas a suitable form of Prayer has been prepared for this purpose, I do hereby authorize and appoint the same to be used on this solemn occasion in all Churches, Chapels and Places of public Worship throughout this Province.
