A PROCLAMATION.
WHEREAS the General Assembly of
this Province stands prorogued to
the first Tuesday in December next
ensuing, I have thought fit further to prorogue
the said General Assembly, and the same
is hereby prorogued to Monday, the third
day of February next, then to meet at Fre-
dericton for the dispatch of business.

On the application of James Taylor junr. of
Fredericton, and Peter and Samuel Dick-
enson of Wakefield, a Mill Reserve comprising
ten thousand acres on the Tobique and Guisack

regulations.

portions of the Reserves as are eligible for settle-
ment, in the rate of one hundred and fifty acres
to each settler; but in such case the proprietor
of the Reserve will be allowed to select a similar
quantity of Timbered Land and have it added to
his Reserve.
