COMMISSIONER FOR A BYE ROAD.
Alexander Mitchell to expend the sum of £50 granted in 1824, for the Road from Jewett's to the new Settlement on the River Macquac.

It having been reported to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, that sundry persons have in contemplation of cutting White Pine Timber on the disputed Territory, during the ensuing Winter, in violation of public Regulations, and of the agreement between His Majesty's Government and that of the United States, this is to forewarn all Persons from trespassing on the said Territory, and to give Public Notice, that in future no duty will be received from Trespassers for any Timber cut thereon; but that instructions are given to the Officer in charge, to seize all Timber he may find cut, and to have the same conveyed to Fredericton, to be sold at Public Auction on account of the Crown.

The British mail for May, which arrived here on Saturday last, brought London dates to the 11th of that month, but we are without any further intelligence of importance beyond what we had previously received through the American papers. The affairs of Spain and Portugal are about being settled, and France had again resumed the appearance of tranquillity.

The speech of Mr. Roebuck appears to be received throughout this Province with feelings of general indignation—with sentiments of pity for the youth, who, after living so long among us, could, from becoming identified with a certain party to which he has attached himself, stand forward the unblushing and bold asserter of calumnies against the people, and that he should prove so ungrateful as to assail the character and conduct of the liberal minded and generous Lord Dalhousie, who was not only the friend of his family, but was one to whom himself, it is said, owes many personal and valuable favours.

The alleged ingratitude, however, of the learned Member for Bath, heartless and ungracious as it most appear to every honest, generous and honourable mind, we fully admit, neither invalidates nor strengthens his arguments—they must be judged solely by their own merits. The boldness of many of his statements we have already noticed; and though there are others to which we could draw public attention, we doubt much whether they are even deserving of that favour, and we are inclined to treat them with the silent contempt they so fully deserve.

We cannot, however, among many others equally open to censure, allow one statement to pass unnoticed, and that is a bold assertion, that the British Government have endeavoured to establish a dominant Protestant Church in Lower Canada, in opposition to the feelings of the people—to destroy the Roman Catholic faith among its numerous adherents—and to excite religious animosity among the members of the opposing churches.

A more calumnious accusation never was made by one who, by Parliamentary courtesy, is termed "Honorable"—none more foreign from the truth—none more fully advanced. In Lower Canada the Roman Catholic religion is essentially and really the dominant Church; its Clergy is fully recognized, and by the laws of the country, maintained in all the rights and privileges possessed at the time of the conquest—the free and uninterrupted exercise of that religion is guaranteed by the most solemn acts of the Government. We feel convinced that the respected Clergy would, if called upon to express themselves, denounce the statement thus unblushingly made by the youthful Member for Bath.

What are the acts of the British Government, which have a tendency to destroy that Church in this country? Where are the religious disturbances which have been excited? We have lived in this Province from our infancy, and without pretending to one tittle of the information possessed by Mr. Roebuck, we must admit we are wholly incompetent to answer these enquiries.—*Mon. Gazette.*
