KING'S COLLEGE, FREDERICTON.

In an official statement, some time since published under the authority of the College Council, the hope was expressed that the Council might find themselves enabled at no very distant period to establish distinct Professorships of Natural Philosophy, Law, and Anatomy and Medicine; by which, as observed in the same document, the circle of Collegiate education would be rendered almost complete. In pursuance of the intention thus announced the Council have now resolved, on His Excellency the Chancellor's recommendation, to appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Pounds per annum by way of salary, together with a suitable residence, for a Professor of Natural Philosophy. His Excellency has at the same time been pleased to depute a Committee, consisting of members of the Council from the Universities of the mother country, to open a correspondence with those distinguished seats of learning, for the selection of a Gentleman duly qualified to receive His Excellency's nomination to the appointment. The Professor of Natural Philosophy will be expected to give the requisite instruction, as well as to exhibit experimental illustration, in the several departments of that comprehensive science. Hence the Mathematical Professor may be enabled to devote an almost exclusive attention to the abstract methods of pure analysis and synthesis; which contain the essential principles of all physical reasoning, while they furnish an exercise of incomparable value in strengthening and directing the intellectual powers, whatever may be the Student's destination or future pursuits.

The arrival of the English Mail for September, has furnished us with London dates to the 2d of that month; from which we have extracted some of the leading opinions of the London press on the important affairs which now occupy the attention of Parliament and the Mother Country.—The Municipal Corporation Bill has undergone a number of amendments in the House of Lords, and has been sent back to the Commons.—The Appropriation clause in the Irish Church Bill was rejected in the House of Lords by a majority of 97. What the result of these measures will be, it is not easy to determine.
