KING'S COLLEGE, FREDERICTON.

Michaelmas Term commenced on Thursday last; the Hebdomadary, or weekly course, for the Term being regulated by the following programme:—

CURRICULUM, on Sunday, morning and afternoon; to be attended by all the students in their academical dress.

CHAPEL, every day except Sunday, at 7 A.M. until November 1, at 8, for the remainder of the Term; and half past 8 P.M. to be attended both morning and evening by resident Students; by such as have a dispensation for non-residence, in the morning only.

PRIVATE TUITION.—First Class, in Aristotle's Rhetoric, Book 3, Monday and Wednesday; Herodotus, Book 7, Tuesday and Thursday; Epistles of Horace, Friday; at a quarter past 10 A.M.—In Wood's Optics, Monday and Wednesday; Vince's Astronomy, Tuesday and Thursday; Scientific Selections, Friday; at 11.

Second Class, in Wood's Algebra, Monday and Wednesday; Wood's Mechanics, Tuesday and Thursday; Euclid, and Bland's Problems, Friday; at a quarter past 10.—In Xenophon's Anabasis, Monday and Wednesday; Sophocles, Thursday; Livy, Tuesday and Friday; at 11.

Third Class, in Homer's Iliad, Monday and Wednesday; Xenophon's Cyropædia, Thursday; Odes of Horace, Tuesday and Friday; at half past 9.—In Euclid, Monday, Wednesday and Friday; Wood's Algebra, Tuesday and Thursday; at a quarter past 12.

Separate instruction in the higher Classics and Mathematics, with Natural Philosophy, for Senior Students preparing for Examination.

PUBLIC LECTURES: in Divinity and Mental Philosophy, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday; in Moral Philosophy and Literature, Wednesday; Logic, Monday and Friday; at 1 P.M.

COMMON REPEATS: at half past 7, A.M. until November 1; afterwards at half past 8; and at 4 and 8 P.M. except on Sunday, when the dinner will be at 5.

N.B.—The several Officers of the College are strictly required by a late Resolution of the Council to keep a register of the attendance and conduct of the Students on all occasions.

The friends of learning will be gratified to hear that this institution is in a decidedly prosperous condition. The number of undergraduate Students at present on its Register amounts to eighteen, and is likely to be considerably increased before the end of the year. Arrangements recently made enable the Officers to maintain a stricter discipline than was heretofore practicable; and provision having been made for the purchase of a philosophical apparatus, the system of instruction may be expected to become more attractive and interesting.

At a Meeting of the Committee of Management for the New Brunswick Baptist Education Society, held on the 3d September, 1835, the following Resolutions were unanimously adopted:—

Resolved, That public notice be immediately given, that the Seminary now being erected at Fredericton, will be opened on Monday, the 4th of January next.

That the rate of Tuition be fixed at from £3 to £5 per annum; Board, Lodging and Washing, at 7s. 6d. per week, making with the deduction of eight weeks vacation £16 10s. per annum; so that the whole expense of Tuition, Board, &c. will amount to £19 10s. at the lowest, and £21 10s. at the highest, per annum, without any other extra charges, except that the Scholars provide their own Bedding and proportion of Fuel in the School Rooms.

That as a part of the Building has been prepared for the accommodation of Female Classes, a competent person be procured to take charge of the same, and arrangements made in the Preceptor's apartments for those who may prefer boarding in the Seminary.

That no charges will be required from those who do not Board in the Building, except for Tuition and Fuel.

Persons wishing to be admitted at the opening of the Institution, or Parents who intend to have their children admitted at that time, will please give information of the same as early as possible to the Secretary of the Committee.

FIRE.—The alarm of Fire was given in this Town on Monday last, about 2 o'clock, P.M. It was found to proceed from a Barn belonging to Mr. George Turner. After destroying that building, it communicated to his dwelling house, and notwithstanding the laudable exertions which were made, the progress of the flames could not be arrested until that building was destroyed and considerable damage done to the house of Mr. Dogherty and to Mr. Biggs' barn adjoining. The Engine Companies and Fire Club were early on the spot, and displayed their usual activity. The valuable assistance which was rendered on that occasion by the Officers and men of the 43d Regiment is beyond all praise; added to which, the utmost exertions of the inhabitants generally were required to save the vast block of buildings contiguous to the fire, which, from the direction of the wind, stood in imminent jeopardy. Mr. Turner's loss is very great. He was absent at the time of the unfortunate occurrence, but we are happy to say that the buildings were insured for £200.
