

Elhot, arrived at Havre on the alternoon of the same day. Com. E. landed immediately and travelled post to Paris, to receive the order of Mr. Livingstone. A Havre paper of the 10th. eays the Constitution had been " employed as is well known, for the purpose of carrying the American Ambassador back to New York in the now improbable event that the vote of twenty-five millions will be rejected by the Chambers." 
