The following are the Terms upon which His Majesty's Government have authorised the granting of Leases to Owners of Lands in New Brunswick who may wish to work Coal situated beneath their own Property.

5. A clause of Forfesture to be added to the preceding conditions, in the event of the lessee omitting, for a specified period, to open a Mine on the property comprised his Lease, or ceasing, for a specified period, to continue such Works as may have een commenced.
