## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to the Second Tuesday in June next, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to Monday the Fifteenth day of June next ensuing; then to meet at Fredericton for the despatch of business.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the Twenty Sixth day of May, in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty five, and in the Fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign.

All Persons liable to pay Quit Rents, are hereby required to pay the amount due since Midsummer 1831, on or before the 24th day of June next, into the Hands of the Receiver General at Fredericton, or into the Hands of the Clerk of the Peace in the County where the Lands for which the Rent is payable are situate, who is authorized to receive and give Receipts therefor—and all those who shall neglect this notice will be reported to the Attorney General, and legal Proceedings will be immediately instituted against them.

Persons wishing to redeem their Rents are informed, that upon payment of the redemption money into the hands of any of those Officers, a Release, under the Great Seal, will be prepared, and forwarded to them free of further expense.

The Terms upon which the redemption will be allowed are as follows:—

At sixteen Years purchase if redeemed on or before the 24th of June 1837.

At eighteen Years purchase if redeemed after that time, and on or before the 24th June 1839.

At twenty Years purchase if not redeemed until after the last mentioned period. These Periods to be calculated from the date of payment of the redemption money.

Such Persons, however, as paid their Rents on the former Requisition, and may now be inclined to redeem, will be allowed to do so at sixteen Years purchase, calculating from Midsummer 1832, provided the redemption money be forthwith paid; but if delayed, the annual Rent must in the mean time be paid.

In cases where Lots or Tracts of Land were originally granted to one Person, or to two or more Persons not in severalty, the Quit Rent must be paid in one sum for the whole Lot or Tract, as no Rent can be received for any fractional part of a Lot or Tract, although it may have been divided among several Proprietors; such Proprietors must settle among themselves the proportions which each is to pay.
