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

Persons wishing to redeem their Rents are informed, that upon payment of the redemption money into the hands of any of those Officers, a Release, under the Great Seal, will be prepared, and forwarded to them free of further expense.

The Terms upon which the redemption will be allowed are as follows :--

At sixteen Years purchase if redeemed on or before the 24th of June 1887. At eighteen Years purchase if redeemed a

ter-that time, and on or before the 24th June 1839. At twenty Years purchase if not redeemed

until after the last mentioned period. These Periods to be calculated from the date of payment of the redemption

Such Persons, however, as paid their Rents on the former Requisition, and may now be inclined to redeem, will be allowed to do so at sixteen Years purchase, calculating from Midsummer 1832, provided the redemption money be forthwith paid; but 2d Do. at Glenelg (at Captain M'Donald's if delayed, the annual Rent must in the mean time be paid.

In cases where Lots or Tracts of Land were originally granted to one Person, or to two or more Persons not in severalty, 2d Do. at Dalhousie, on Wednesday Sth do. the Quit Rent must be paid in one sum for the whole Lot or Tract, as no Rent can be 1st Division at Poakshaw, on Friday 10th July received for any fractional part of a Lot or 2d Tract, although it may have been divided among several Proprietors; such Proprietors must settle among themselves the proportions which each is to pay.
