In this opinion, both Lord Aberdeen and
myself have concurred, and a clause will,
therefore, be introduced into the Customs
Amendment Bill of the present Session, ex-
tending to New Brunswick the same free-
dom from duty with reference to those ar-
ticles as is enjoyed by the Canadian Provin-
ces; but in order to obviate any inconve-
nience which might otherwise arise, it is
not intended that this provision should take
effect until the 1st January, 1836.

REPORT
OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT,
Presented to the
New Brunswick Baptist Education Society,
At its Annual Meeting, held at Prince William,
on the 7th July, 1835.
THE Committee of Management, in pre-
sented to the New Brunswick Baptist
Education Society, at its anniversary meet-
ing, a brief report of their proceedings for
the past year, beg to remark, that, agree-
ably to the instructions received from the
Society at its last meeting, they immediately
purchased a most pleasant and eligible site
at Fredericton, and entered into a contract
with Messrs. Burpe & Taylor to erect a suit-
able building thereon for the purposes of
education,—that the building is now in a
state of forwardness, and is to be completed
by the first day of October next.
That your Committee have already paid
towards the erection of the building and for
the purchase of land, about £900.—That
about £700 have been collected, leaving a
balance due the Committee of £200.
That the contract for the principal build-
ing, including some alterations which your
Committee have considered it necessary to
make, together with the purchase of land,
will amount to about £1700;—that the fur-
ther sum of £300 will be required for the
erection of out buildings, fences, &c.
That the sum of about £1200 has been
subscribed, leaving a deficiency of £500 to
be raised, with a reasonable allowance for
such sums as may not be collected of the
amount already subscribed.
Your Committee feel much pleasure in
tendering their acknowledgments to the pub-
lic for the prompt assistance afforded during
the past year, considering the pressure of
business and scarcity of money for that pe-
riod, and rely with implicit confidence on
their continued liberality to enable them to
accomplish this most desirable object.
Your Committee cannot close this brief
report without noticing the very liberal
grant made by the House of Assembly, at
its last annual meeting, in aid of their un-
dertaking, although they have to regret that
the Legislative Council should have consid-
ered it expedient to reject the said grant,
recommended, as it was, by about six hun-
dred respectable individuals belonging to the
several religious denominations in this Pro-
vince, and passed by the almost unanimous
vote of the House—especially when they re-
collect that liberal grants have been made
in a Sister Colony in aid of a similar in-
stitution.
Your Committee have not thought it ne-
cessary to lengthen their report by entering
more minutely into particulars at this time,
it being their intention to lay before the So-
ciety and the public, as soon as possible after
the Seminary shall be completed, a de-
tailed account of all monies collected and ex-
pended—showing what amount has been
subscribed and paid, or subscribed and re-
maining unpaid, by each individual, and in
what manner expended.
