His Excellency, the Lieutenant Governor having received His Majesty's Commands to resume the Collection of the Quit Rents in this Province, PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that these Orders are immediately to be carried into full effect; and all Persons owing Quit Rent are hereby required respectively, to pay the amount due since Midsummer, 1831, (the period to which His Majesty was pleased to remit them,) to the Receiver General at Fredericton, or to such Deputies as shall be appointed in the several Counties, on or before Midsummer next, or in default of so doing Legal Proceedings will be then instituted against them.

All Persons, however, who may be desirous of redeeming their Rents, will be permitted so to do, at Sixteen Years purchase, if the redemption money be paid on or before Midsummer, 1837—or at Eighteen Years purchase, if paid by Midsummer, 1839.

Persons not taking advantage of these periods will be required, after Midsummer, 1839, to pay Twenty Years purchase for the redemption.
