

II. And be it enacted, That any person or persons who shall violate any of the rules so to be made as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five pounds with costs for each and every offence; to be recovered on conviction thereof by the oath of one or more credible witnesses before any one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said County of York, to be levied by Warrant of distress and sale of the offender's goods and chattels, rendering the overplus (if any) to such offender, and for want of sufficient goods and chattels whereon to levy, the said Justice is hereby authorized and required to commit such offender to the common Gaol of the said County, there to remain for a term not less than five and not exceeding ten days.

III. And be it enacted, That one half of every penalty which may be recovered for the breach of any rule or regulation made by virtue of this Act shall be paid to the person or persons who shall prosecute for the same, and the other half thereof shall be paid to the overseers of the poor of the Town or Parish where such offence had been committed, to be applied to the use of the poor of such Town or Parish.

IV. And be it enacted, That each and every of the Parishioners on the said Nashua River shall be considered as competent witnesses in any prosecution under this Act, excepting any person entitled as prosecutor to any part of the penalty sued for.

V. And be it enacted, That this Act shall continue and be in force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven and no longer.
