



XVI. And be it enacted, 'That if any person or persons do or shall hereafter alter, stop up or encroach on' any Street, Highway or public Road, by laying Timber, Wood, Rubbish, Stones, Carts, Trucks, or any thing

XXI. And be it enacted, That every person when called upon by any one of the said Commissioners shall, within twenty-four hours, give and render to the said Commissioner, a particular account and statement, in writing, containing the names of all persons who may be in his, her or their employ, or who may be resident in the House kept or occupied by such person or persons, and who may be liable to perform labour on the Highways: such statement to contain not only the names of persons belonging to his, her or their family, but also the names of any Boarders, Lodgers and domestic Servants, who may be liable as aforesaid; and if any such person or persons shall neglect or refuse to render such account when so called upon, or shall give and render a false or incorrect account or statement, he or she shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five pounds to be sued for and recovered by any one of the Commissioners of the said Parish.

XXVIII. And be it enacted, That if any person shall wilfully cut down or destroy any of the Bushes so to be erected by virtue of the Act, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of twenty shillings upon conviction before any one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace upon the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses, to be levied by Warrant of distress and sale of the offender's goods, rendering the overplus (if any) after deducting the costs and charges, to the offender; one half of the said forfeiture to be applied to the use of the Poor of the Town or Parish where such offence shall be committed, the other moiety to him or them who shall inform and sue for the same; and for want of such effects to levy on the offender or offenders shall be imprisoned for a term not exceeding Six Days.
