

ance would unquestionably limit the Freeholders in the choice of their Representatives in the several Counties throughout this Province to such persons only as could afford to give their time, and bear their own expenses, during the sitting of the Legislature, and would therefore deeply affect the Elective Franchise, and the rights, privileges and liberties of His Majesty's Subjects within this Province: therefore.

"Resolved, That this House cannot discontinue the aforesaid grant without abandoning some of the most essential rights and privileges of His Majesty's Loyal and faithful subjects in this Province: and further.

"Resolved, That the aforesaid allowance be included among the Supplies of the present Session."

To which Mr. Partelow moved as an amendment, to strike out the whole of the last Resolution, beginning at the words "and further Resolved."

And upon the question, the House divided as follows:—

Yeas:—Messrs. Allen, End, Crane, Partelow, Johnston, Street, Slason, J. M. Wil-

mot.

Nays:—Messrs. L. A. Wilmot, Freeze, Clinch, Hill, Brown, Woodward, Gilbert, M'Leod, Miles, Hayward, Connell, Taylor, Stewart, Morehouse.

When it was decided in the negative.

The question was then taken upon the original Resolutions, whereupon the Committee again divided:—Yeas, 14. Nays, 8.

And they were carried in the affirmative.

Thursday, March 11.

Mr. L. A. Wilmot, from the Committee of Privileges, submitted a Report which he read, and is as follows.

"The Committee of Privileges, to whom was referred the Message of the Legislative Council, of the 27th February, relative to the Appropriations made by this House, for the payment of the Clerks and the Clerks Assistant of the said Council and this House respectively, beg leave to report, that they have had the said Message under their consideration, and they find no precedent in the Legislative Journals of this Province for the Resolution communicated to this House in the said Message, and they are of opinion, that the said Resolution is a dictation to this House, as to the mode of granting Supplies for certain Public Services, and is therefore a breach of the Privileges of this House."

"L. A. WILMOT, Chairman.

"Committee Room, 12th March, 1835."

The Report being handed in at the Clerk's Table, was there again read.

Ordered, That the Report be accepted.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The House went into Committee of the whole, on a Bill to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue to the payment of the Ordinary Services of the Province.

Mr. Allen in the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported, that having the Bill referred to them under their consideration, the following was moved as an amendment, to be added to the Bill:

"To the Speaker of the House of Assembly, the sum of — pounds for the present Session, and to each and every Member of the House of Assembly for defraying the expenses of attendance in General Assembly, for each and every day's attendance, the sum of — per day, such attendance to be certified by the Speaker; and for travelling charges of each and every Member, the sum of — per day, allowing twenty miles for each day's travel, to be certified by the Speaker."

And upon the question for adopting the amendment, the Committee divided as follows:

Yeas:—Messrs. Speaker, Taylor, Hill, Woodward, L. A. Wilmot, Clinch, Brown, Freeze, Gilbert, M'Leod, Miles, Hayward, Morehouse, Connell, Johnston, Stewart.

Nays:—Messrs. End, Slason, Crane, Partelow, Street, J. M. Wilmot.

And it was carried in the affirmative.

And the several blanks filled up with one hundred pounds, fifteen shillings, and fifteen shillings.

That the following Resolution was then moved:

"Resolved, That the several items of Appropriation passed this Session in Supply, be included in one Bill."

And upon the question for sustaining the Resolution, the Committee again divided as follows:

Yeas:—Messrs. Speaker, Taylor, Hill, Woodward, L. A. Wilmot, Clinch, Brown, Freeze, Gilbert, M'Leod, Miles, Hayward, Morehouse, Connell, Johnston, Stewart.

And it was passed in the affirmative.

And that the Committee then went through the Bill, and agreed to the same with amendments, under the Title of "A Bill to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue to the payment of the Ordinary Services of the Province, and for other Services therein mentioned."

Ordered, That the Report be accepted, and the Bill engrossed as amended, under the amended Title.

QUEBEC, FEBRUARY 27.

Privilege of a Colonial Assembly.—We have just heard that Mr. Speaker Papineau has issued his warrant for taking into the custody of the Sergeant at arms; Henry Jessop, Esquire, Collector of His Majesty's Customs, on the ground of his refusing to obey a resolution calling for certain papers

in his department, without either his having received the order of the Governor or that of any competent officer of the empire.—*Neillon's Gazette.*

Tuesday, March 3.—This day, pursuant to appointment, the members of the Assembly, with the hon. Speaker and the Officers of the House, waited upon His Excellency the Governor in Chief, with their Address in answer to his Speech at the opening of the Session. The Address having been read, His Excellency was pleased to make the following reply:—

"Mr. Speaker and

Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

"It has been my custom, as well as that of, I believe, all my predecessors in office, to transmit to the secretary of state for the colonial department, a copy of the address of the house of assembly in answer to the speech of the governor, or person administering the government, at the opening of each session, and this shall be done in the like manner in the present instance."

March 2.—Henry Jessop, Esq. Collector of the Customs, was not committed to jail till yesterday evening, at seven, having transferred, during the day, some furniture, &c. to the common jail. His arrest took place on Saturday morning; he was on parole till four, when the warrant for his commitment was ordered on motion of Mr. Leslie, without his being brought to the bar of the Assembly. As a public officer, he declined, on Saturday, the offer of a very large number of persons who were desirous to walk with him to the jail.

As we foresaw, wordy resolutions have closed the sittings of our Assembly, and it has progressed itself! There has been nothing else done than empty talk, and giving further proofs of empiricism, rancour and recklessness. This is all that it could do, for its component parts are in no wise calculated by acquisitions for real practical business. We are tired and the reader more so, of the verbiage of the debates and proceedings. Nothing will be so well received and so generally approved as this marching off to their "respective homes" which we trust they will all be able to effect without serious personal sacrifices.

The House of Assembly met to-day at twelve o'clock, and received a Message from the Governor-in-Chief, submitting to it the usual statement of the accounts and expenditure of the past year, and asking it to provide for the same. Many of the Members sat with their cloaks and caps on, and it was observed that the fires had gone out. The motion to adjourn to to-morrow at noon was carried—Yeas, 44; Nays, 6.

A number of the Members of the Assembly have left town, and more are preparing to move. The position of the House and the temper of its Members are the common subjects of humorous conversation.—*Quebec Gaz.*, March 6.
