## A BILL

To incorporate The Washademoak Mill  
Company.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant  
Governor, Legislative Council  
and Assembly, That Geo. F. S. Ber-  
ton, James Taylor, John A. Beckwith,  
Francis E. Beckwith, Stephen Miller,  
James Rait and Neil D. Shaw, their  
associates, successors and assigns, be  
and they are hereby created, and de-  
clared to be a body politic and corpo-  
rate by the name of the Washademoak  
Mill Company, and by that name shall  
have all the general powers and privi-  
leges made incident to a Corporation  
by Act of Assembly in this Province.

II. And be it enacted, That the first  
meeting of the said Corporation shall  
and may be held at Fredericton, in the  
County of York, and shall and may be  
called by Geo. F. S. Berton, Esq. or  
in case of his death or neglect or refusal,  
by any two of the said Company, by  
publishing notice thereof for twenty days  
in the Royal Gazette at Fredericton.

III. And be it enacted, That the ca-  
pital stock of the said Company shall  
consist of the sum of £20,000, to be  
paid in such money as shall at the time  
of the several payments hereinafter ex-  
pressed be a legal tender in the Pro-  
vince, £4000 being one fifth part there-  
of to be paid within three years after  
the passing of this Act, and the remain-  
der of the said stock, being £16,000, to  
be paid at such time and times, and in  
such parts or portions as the Directors  
for the time being shall from time to  
time think necessary, the whole amount  
of such capital or stock to be divided  
into shares of ten pounds each, making  
the whole 2,000 shares; and provided in  
that the said Corporation shall not be  
entitled to purchase any property real  
or personal, or to incur any debts until  
the said sum of £4,000 be paid in.

IV. Provided always and be it fur-  
ther enacted, That so soon as the said  
capital stock of £20,000 shall have  
been paid in and expended for the pur-  
poses by this Act provided, it shall and  
may be lawful for the said Stockhold-  
ers at any general meeting, to be for  
that purpose called, to increase the said  
capital stock from time to time in such  
sums as they may deem expedient to a  
sum not exceeding £50,000, to be as-  
sessed upon the several Stockholders of  
the said Company in proportion to their  
respective shares.

V. And be it enacted, That the joint  
property and stock of the said Company  
shall alone be responsible for the engage-  
ments and debts of the said Company.

VI. And be it enacted, That a state-  
ment of the affairs and amount of prop-  
erty of the said Company shall be made  
by the said Company once in every  
year, shewing the amount assessed  
and paid in by the proprietors of shares,  
and the amount and value (as near as  
may be) of the funds and property of  
the said Company, and the amount of  
debts due from such Company, which  
statement shall be certified as correct  
by the President, and Secretary and  
Treasurer of the said Company under  
oath, each swearing to the best of his  
knowledge and belief respectively, and  
such statement shall be forthwith pub-  
lished in the Royal Gazette or some  
other newspaper as aforesaid.

VII. Provided always and be it en-  
acted, That unless the sum of £4,000  
of the said capital stock shall be ac-  
tually paid in for the purposes of the  
said Corporation, and a certificate of  
such payment signed and verified on  
oath by the said Directors or a major-  
ity of them, which oath any Justice of  
the Peace may administer, shall be  
filed in the office of the Secretary of the  
Province before the expiration of three  
years after the passing of this Act, the  
operation of this Act shall cease, and  
the existence of the said Corporation be  
terminated at the expiration of the  
said three years.
