ANOTHER WHALER.—On Thursday evening, a coppered and copper fastened ship of about 400 tons, called the "MECHANIC," built for the Saint John Mechanics' Whale Fishing Company, was launched from the Ship Yard of Messrs. OLIVE, in Carleton. She was visited by many of our citizens and others, who take an interest in the new branch of trade from this port, for which she is intended, and has been pronounced a beautifully modelled & faithfully built vessel, admirably adapted for her intended pursuit. This, we believe, is the fifth vessel built in the Province expressly for the Whaling trade. ATTEMPTED MURDER.—On the 18th inst. an attempt was made by John Murphy, a settler on the old Quaco Road, in this County, to murder Solomon Burchell, of that place, by discharging a loaded gun at him. Burchell was dangerously wounded, and is not expected to survive. Murphy has absconded. He is represented in the Hue and Cry, which has been issued by Alderman Van Horne, for his apprehension, as a person about 50 years of age—5 feet 6 inches in height—stout made—full face and red cheeks—is a little bald, and has lost two of his front teeth.—We have not heard any particulars of the cause which led to the commission of this outrageous act.—*Ibid.*

ROBBERY.—Mr. John O'Dougherty, of Gagetown, was some time ago robbed of £100. The thieves were traced to this City by Mr. O'Dougherty, and apprehended this morning on board a vessel bound to Hopewell. They were two sisters, by the name of Cairns, the eldest of whom appeared to be about 18 years of age, and were servants
