Meeting of the Nova Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society.—A numerous and highly respectable Meeting of this Society, was held in the upper room of the Acadia School on Monday evening. BERMUDA, May 3.
Arrived on Sunday last, H. M. Line of Battle Ship Melville, Captain Douglas, bearing the Flag of Vice Admiral Sir Peter Halket, successor to Vice Admiral the Right Hon. Sir George Cockburn, in the North American and West India command. The Melville was saluted as she passed Fort Catherine, and subsequently exchanged salutes with the President, Sir George's Flag Ship. The Melville is last from Madeira, and out 42 days from Portsmouth.—*Passengers*, Miss Halket, John Halket, Esq., Flag Lieutenant, Lady, and two children, and James A. Smith, Esq. Secretary to Sir Peter.

JAMAICA.—We learn from Jamaica that the House of Assembly had refused to proceed to business, on the day to which the Legislature stood prorogued, as mentioned in our last Gazette, and that a further prorogation by Proclamation had taken place. It was currently reported at Kingston, that the Earl of Munster was to succeed the Marquis of Sligo as Governor of Jamaica, and that the latter was preparing for his departure.
