A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Tuesday the twentieth day of September instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the third Tuesday in December next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the Tenth Day of September in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty six, and in the Seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign.

ORDERED. That in future no claims for payment of services performed for or on account of, His Majesty's Government in this Province, be allowed, unless such claims are preferred within two months after the expiration of the year within which the services have been performed.

ORDERED. That no Officer of the Government in the receipt of monies belonging to the Crown, be allowed to retain in his hands any part of such monies as a set off or balance of any account or claim against the Government; but that the whole of such monies be forthwith paid over to the Receiver General; and any account or claim which such Officer may have against the Government, being first duly examined and allowed, to be paid by Warrant of the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief of the Province for the time being, and not otherwise.
