CHERCH QUESTION -The following extract from the Constitution of the new and promising colony of South Australia. shows the views of the present as well as the Forv Ministry of England on the sub jet of churches, &c. in the Colonies. Constitution referred to was partly the work of Sir Robert Peel, and partly of the prosent Ministry : and was published in the "Smith Austrilian Gazette," the first number of which was printed in London, dated 18 h Jane. 1336. the second is vet to be published ina city of the wilderness, of which the site in yet unkno vn:-

. It is enacted, That His Majesty shall empower any persons who shall seem fit to his Privy Council, to frame laws and estabhist courts, to appoint office.s, chaplains. and cleigymen of the established Church of England or Scotland, and to lovy such duties and taxes as shall be neessary to the well being of the Colony-such laws to be laid before the King in Council with all convenient expedition."


