SALE OF CROWN LANDS BY PUBLIC AUCTION.

A Sale of vacant and Surveyed CROWN LANDS will be held at the Crown Land Office, on MONDAY the 4th July next. The Lands to be offered are in the Counties of York, Charlotte, Carleton and Saint John.

BY authority of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, under instructions from His Majesty's Government, **PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that for the future all Crown Lands will be sold by Public Auction, and that monthly sales will take place at the Crown Land Office on the first Monday in every month—the lowest upset price will be Six Shillings per Acre, by four annual instalments, with a discount of fifteen per cent. if all paid at the time of Sale; and in order to afford the public every reasonable facility in the acquisition of Land, any person who may be desirous that any particular Lot should be submitted to sale, will send a description of the same to the Crown Land Office at least six weeks prior to the day of Sale, that it may be introduced into the notice of such Sale.

Purchasers paying by Instalments will be required to pay the first Instalment at the time of Sale, and give Bonds to the King for the balance due; upon which a grant will be prepared with the least possible delay.

Persons who may have taken possession of Land without authority, and who have been settled more than a year, are allowed until the 31st of December next to make a payment on the Land they occupy, at such price as His Excellency shall direct, and will be admitted to the same advantages as persons purchasing by Auction.

So many repeated notices respecting Squatters having already been published, such of that description of settlers as may neglect to avail themselves of this last notice, are hereby warned, that in making sales of Crown Land after the 1st of January, 1837, no attention will be paid to their occupancies.

All Deputy Surveyors are hereby required to report to me immediately, any case of a person taking possession of Crown Lands after this notice, without proper authority, for so doing, in order that he may be proceeded against by His Majesty's Attorney General for trespass and intrusion.

RESOLVED, That for the future, in the account of the Overseers of the Poor for any Parish in which relief shall be extended to Emigrants, which accounts shall be transmitted to this House with the view of procuring reimbursement from the Emigrant fund, it shall be made to appear in a separate column, stating the names of such Emigrants, that every such Emigrant for whom a charge is made, has arrived in the Province within one year immediately before the time of such relief being so extended, or otherwise this House will not agree to an appropriation for any such charges; this resolution being in the opinion of this House necessary, in order to comply with the spirit and intention of the Emigrant Act, 2 W. 4, c. 26.
