James Laurie to expend the following sums:

FIRE.—On Saturday morning last, an
alarm of fire was given in this town.

The fire was discovered to originate in
a barn on the premises of Mr. Perks' in
Queen Street, and in a short space
of time communicated to his dwelling
house, which was burnt to the ground.

The house adjoining owned by the heirs
of the late Mr. Blaiher, and a house
belonging to the estate of Mr. S. Gros-
vener, deceased, were also destroyed,

together with several outhouses &c.
Two of the buildings, we understand,
are insured, but considerably below
their value. The whole of the con-
tents of the buildings were saved with
a few exceptions.

Great praise is due
to the Military, Fire Companies and
inhabitants generally for their united
exertions in arresting the progress of
the flames and preventing the further
destruction of the surrounding property,
for the safety of which some fears were
entertained.
