COMMISSIONERS OF BYE ROADS. NORTHUMBERLAND.

James Louie to expend the following sums:

£25 in exploring and opening a road in rear of the front lots in Newcastle, from the road leading from Newcastle to Chaplain's Island, to the main north west road leading to M'Kay's.

£15 to complete the road from James Cassey's to the back lots, and thence in front upwards to the road leading to Chaplain's Island.

James Gilmour to expend the following sums:

£25 to complete the road leading from Duncan Stewart's in rear of Douglas town to the settlement in rear of Moorfield's.

£30 in completing the bridge at Fraser's mills, north side north west branch of Miramichi river.

£10 to explore and open a new line of road between Caul's cove and Oxford's cove.

£25 towards improving the road between Fraser's mill cove and Charles Dalon's.

£45 for the road from Newcastle to Chaplain's Island on the north west branch of Miramichi.

Alexander Goodfellow to expend the following sums:

£10 for improving the road between Lots 54 and 55 to the rear of the second tier of Lots in the Parish of Newcastle.

£10 to continue the road on the west side of Big Bartibog from John Wright's upwards.

£10 to improve the road from Curry's on the Bartibog to Green brook.

William Joplin to expend the following sums:

£25 to improve the road from Wilson's Lot on the Rock Heads, Chatham, to Carruthers on the River Napan.

£15 in aid of subscription to continue the road from Saint John's Church, Chatham, to strike the River Napan opposite the residence of Thomas Hannah, and thence to George Kerr's Lot.

£15 to improve the road from the road in front of the second tier of Lots to the third tier in the rear of Saint Paul's Church.

£100 in addition to the grant of last Session to assist in the erection of a bridge across Little Black River on the site determined upon last summer by the Commissioners.

£25 for the road leading from Horton's creek to John M'Donald's place on the Bay du Vin, thence towards Kingston's.

£20 for the road on the south side of the Miramichi River between Barnaby's River and Peter Stewart's farm.

£20 for the road between Nelson Village and Barnaby's River.

£15 to explore and open a road from Sutton's barn, Nelson, to the third tier of Lots near to Thomas Oats' farm.

£15 to improve the road from the south side of Barnaby's River between Lots Nos. 8 and 9 to the Semiawan hardwood ridge.

£15 to improve the road from Newlan's farm back of Nelson to the upper settlement, Barnaby's River.

£20 to improve the road from Patrick Whalen's on the north side of Renou's River to Indian Town.

£20 to assist in making and improving the road on the south side of the south west branch of Miramichi River from Wm. Hogan's towards Robert Doak's.

£15 to assist in erecting a bridge across M'Allister's brook on the south side of the south west branch of Miramichi.

£25 towards erecting a bridge across John Goodfellow's brook at the place appointed last Fall.

£15 for the road leading from the lower Williamstown settlement to the main north west near Jared Tozer's.

£10 to improve the road on the south side of the little south west from Cuppage and White's to James Holmes' through the Indian land.

RESOLVED, That for the future, in the accounts of the Overseers of the Poor for any Parish in which relief shall be extended to Emigrants, which accounts shall be transmitted to this House with the view of procuring reimbursement from the Emigrant fund, it shall be made to appear in a separate column, stating the names of such Emigrants, that every such Emigrant for whom a charge is made, has arrived in the Province within one year immediately before the time of such relief being so extended, otherwise this House will not agree to an appropriation for any such charge; this restriction being in the opinion of this House necessary, in order to comply with the spirit and intention of the Emigrant Act, 2 W. 4, c. 26.

RESOLVED, That the foregoing resolution be published for eight successive weeks in the Royal Gazette.
