On Saturday, the 16th, a very fine wellbuilt ship of 757 tons Register, old measurement, named the Hercules, was launched in gallant style at the Ship Yard of John Jardine, Esq. at Richibucto. The length of her keel is 132 feet, and she measures over all 152 feet; being the largest vessel but one ever built in the Province. The materials of which she is composed, the workmanship bestowed upon her, the form and mould of her hull, and the appearance of her frame after the launch, reflected the highest credit on all concerned in her construction. It is but about six weeks ago the same enterprising gentleman launched another vessel of 475 tons Register, old measurement, called the Jane & Margaret, having 122 feet keel, and measuring 136 feet over all. Three additional vessels are now laid down, one of which we hear is to be launched in the fall. Activity, energy, and enterprise-like thisdeserve the highest reward of success; and most sincerely do we wish that such a result will be the consequence to so much industry and persevering exertions .-- Miramichi Gleaner.

SAINT ANDREWS RAIL ROAD .- Among the arrivals at the Albion Hotel, yesterday, was J. Wilson, Esquire, of St. Andrews, N. B. agent of the projected Railway from that town to Quebec. The very liberal support this undertaking has met on the part of Lord Glenelg and the authorities, will probably be supported by the home and colonial public.

We have seen a Map and Plan of the Rai!way from Saint Andrews, (a port open to navigation at all seasons of the year, ) executed with skill. It indicates the exact line of route to be followed, which turns round the point of the monument of the North Eastern Boundary.
