The English Mail for February arrived here on Monday last, which furnishes us with London dates to the 4th and Falmouth to the 6th of that month. Parliament was opened by His Majesty in person, on the 4th ult. The Speech throughout is congratulatory to the English nation on the happy and prosperous condition of public affairs, both at home and abroad; and represents the state of the Commerce and Manufactures of the United Kingdom as highly satisfactory.
