## PUBLIC NOTICE.

The following Regulations respecting the purchase of Crown Lands in this Province, received by the last Mail from England, are, by order of His Majesty's Government, to be strictly pursued.

"From and after the first day of June next, Purchasers of Land, belonging to the Crown, will be required to pay down at the time of Sale ten per cent on the whole value of the purchase; and the remainder within fourteen days from the day of Sale; and until the whole price is paid, the Purchaser will not be put in possession of the Land. In the event of Payment not being made within the prescribed period, the sale will be considered void, and the deposit be forfeited."

Persons desirous of purchasing Crown Lands, are required to transmit to the Crown Land Office a description of such Lands, when it vacant and surveyed, it will be offered at an upset price at Public Sale, subject to the conditions after due notice given.

The foregoing arrangement is intended to save the applicants for land needless trouble and expense.

**NOTICE** is hereby given, that the Stockholders of the Saint John and Saint Croix River Canal Company, will petition the Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick, at their next Session, to pass an Act, authorising the said Company to construct a Branch Canal, a copy of which Act is as follows.

**WHEREAS** it is deemed expedient to enable the Saint John and Saint Croix River Canal Company to construct a branch of the said Canal from some point on the route named in their charter or Act of Incorporation to the head or source of the Monument Brook;

1. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That the Saint John and Saint Croix River Canal Company be and they are hereby empowered and authorised to build and construct, and to repair and keep in repair a Branch Canal from some part of the Chipmunketcook Lake to the Head or source of the Monument Brook; and that in the constructing and building the said Branch of said Canal, and procuring materials for the same, and in buying, assessing and collecting Toll on all articles passing through the said Branch of said Canal, and in all and every matter and thing touching or relating to the said branch Canal or the route thereof, the said Company shall have the same rights, privileges and immunities, and be subject to the same liabilities and restrictions as are given, made or declared in the said Act of Incorporation of said Company for the said main or principal Canal; and that the said branch of said Canal, shall in all things be deemed and be a part and parcel of the said principal Canal.

2. And be it further enacted, That the said Company shall have power and right to increase their Capital Stock if required for the purpose of constructing the said Branch Canal, by any sum the said Company may deem expedient, not to exceed twenty five thousand pounds, to be divided into Shares and paid in, in the manner provided for the Capital Stock of the said Company: Provided always, that fifteen per cent. upon the amount of such increased Capital Stock may be paid in at any time within three years from the passing of this Act.
