

and the people; for it was by assisting the banks that they were to relieve the people, and the House should give a free expression of their opinions upon the subject, or else, how could they expect that the Governor could be made acquainted with the feelings of the country?

The Attorney General said, that he was sorry to see a disposition on the part of some Honourable Members to split straws. In the speech from the Throne, there were no positive assertions as to the causes of the present commercial difficulties; nor was there any thing in the address which pledged the House. Mr. Sherwood and Mr. Gowen respectively, read resolutions which they intended to propose. The latter gentleman observed, that the Governor, in his speech had weighed the arguments for and against the stoppage of specie payments, and had balanced the scales, leaving the House to exercise its own opinion. Dr. Rolph observed that banking was a subject in relation to which a great diversity of opinion existed; and how should it be expected that all should be prepared to adopt the sentiments of the Governor? He should vote against the wholesale proposition of the Attorney General regarding the address. The Attorney said that no one could deny that character to that young Province was above every pecuniary consideration, such principles contained no pledge of the course of that House—no expression further than that in order to get capital, credit, and population from the mother country, it was necessary that they should clearly demonstrate that their life and property were secure; that justice was inflexibly administered; that engagements were unscrupulously fulfilled; and that when assailed by clamour, or commercial adversity, that House would rally round the Throne for the protection of the public creditor. None could therefore object to the sentiments contained in the address. Let it go forth to the world, that while crash had succeeded upon crash in the neighbouring country—that while a whole nation had fallen into bankruptcy—that while a mighty people were forced to the very lowest state of depression for want of public faith—that the little Province of Upper Canada, shut out from the rest of the world, and almost denied access to the sea, would ever be ready to protect the public creditor in whatever storm of commercial adversity. After a few words from Messrs. Gowen, Sherwood and Merritt, the proposition of the Attorney General was agreed to by a majority of 23 to 16.—*Mercury*.

From the New-York Advertiser, June 26.

"We have the melancholy duty of recording the death of SAMUEL NEILSON, Esq. Editor of the old *Quebec Gazette*, and son of John Neilson, Esq. of that city. Mr. Neilson passed several weeks in this city last autumn, for the benefit of his health, and sailed hence for the Mediterranean for that object. He arrived at the quarantine ground on Friday evening, in a very feeble condition. On Saturday we were supplied by him with the latest Malaga and Gibraltar papers, accompanied by a message that he would be with us at three o'clock. He came not; and before the day had closed, was numbered with the dead. His funeral will be attended this afternoon at the quarantine ground. The deceased was a gentleman of character, of the most amiable disposition, and, in one word of sterling worth. We tender our sympathies to his venerable father and the family circle, for this painful bereavement."

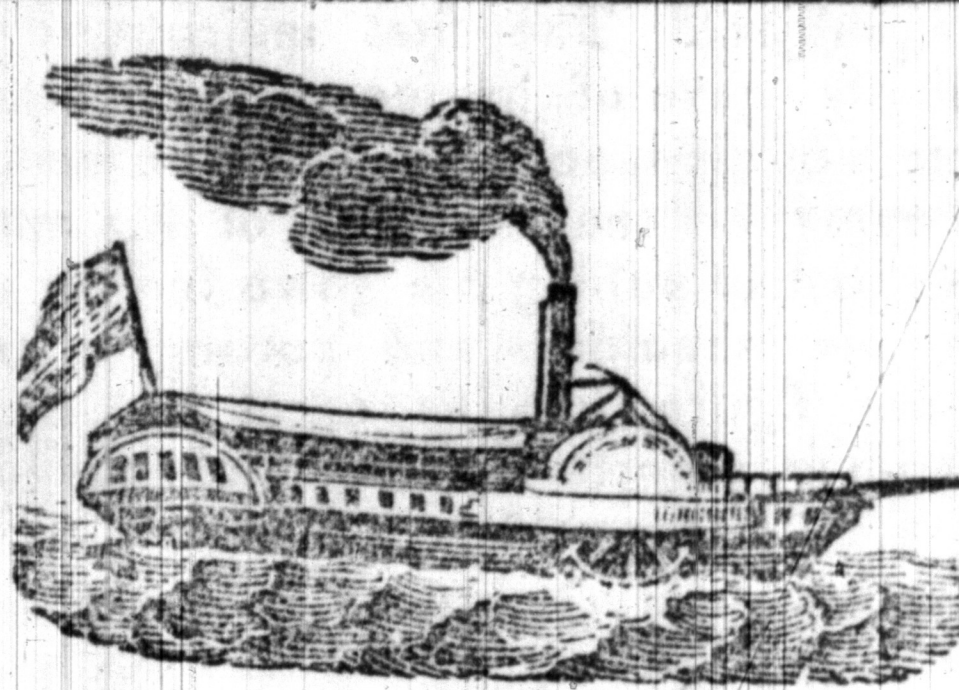
