A PROCLAMATION.

PUBLIC NOTICE.

The following Regulations respecting the purchase of Crown Lands in this Province, received by the last Mail from England, are, by order of His Majesty's Government, to be strictly pursued.

"From and after the first day of June next, Purchasers of Land belonging to the Crown will be required to pay down at the time of Sale ten per cent on the whole value of the purchase; and the remainder within fourteen days from the day of Sale; and until the whole price is paid, the Purchaser will not be put in possession of the Land. In the event of Payment not being made within the prescribed period, the sale will be considered void, and the deposit be forfeited."

Persons desirous of purchasing Crown Lands, are required to transmit to the Crown Land Office a description of such Lands, when if vacant and surveyed, it will be offered at an upset price at Public Sale, subject to the conditions after due notice given.

The foregoing arrangement is intended to save the applicants for land needless trouble and expense.
