That the Deputy shall receive one quarter of all double duties collected, and in case the Timber, Logs or Lumber be seized in default of the payment of the duties, the seizing officer shall be entitled to one third of the net proceeds of the sale of the same.

That the Deputies render a detailed account of all double duties collected, and seizures made by them, stating the name of the person or persons trespassing, the qualities, and when cut, whether in excess or without licence (as the case may be); if in excess state the number, date and quantity applied for in such licence.
