To the Archdeacon and Clergy of the Established Church, &c. &c. &c.

Venerable Sir,  
and Reverend Gentlemen,

For your expressions of personal respect towards myself, I tender you my warm acknowledgments.

The death of our late beloved Sovereign, was an event which was mourned by all classes of His Majesty's subjects; as the accession of our present most Gracious Queen was hailed with universal hope and delight.

That these feelings pervaded a body which has gloried in its loyalty from the earliest ages, can no more be doubted than that they were fully participated in by the Clergy of that branch of the established Church planted in this loyal Province.

While, as a Member of that Church, one deeply interested in her prosperity, as well as in my capacity of Her Representative Head in this Province, I fully appreciate those feelings of ardent loyalty which, unbought by favour or patronage, can exist independent of their continuance, yet, without more fully adverting to the causes which may appear to you to have cast a temporary shade upon the favour by which the established Church had been heretofore pre-eminently distinguished, I do not hesitate in claiming for Her Majesty's present advisers as strong a desire to maintain Her in all Her just rights, and to perpetuate Her in her close and indissoluble connexion with the State, as any of their Predecessors at any period of Her History. For myself, I trust I shall not be found wanting upon any occasion upon which I may be appealed to, in rendering all the support in my power to an Establishment, which I feel to be associated with all that is great, all that is venerable, all that is pure in the History and condition of the British Empire.

LONDON, Dec. 25.  
The greatest excitement has prevailed in the money market all day. Consols opened at 93, but the rush of sellers were so constant and persevering, that they commenced declining immediately, and so continued until at half past 1, the prices were 91 3/4 & 3/4. They finally closed in a very feverish state at 92 3/4, as the nearest price for the opening. Bank Stock 204; Exchequer Bills at 21 2/3 per day, 41s. to 43s. and India Bonds, 26s. to 28s. premium.

The depression in foreign securities followed, if it did not quite equal, that in Consols.
