SIR,—I have the honor to inform you, that the Queen has been pleased to appoint the Earl of Durham, to be Governor General of all Her Majesty's Provinces, within and adjacent to the Continent of North America.

Extract of a Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to His Excellency Sir John Harvey, dated Downing Street, 16th February, 1838.

"I have received and laid before the Queen your Despatch of the 10th January last, transmitting copies of some resolutions passed unanimously by both branches of the Legislature, expressive of their gratitude to Sir Francis Head, and to the Militia of Upper Canada, for the promptitude and energy with which, unaided by any of Her Majesty's regular Troops, they had suppressed the insurrection which had broken out in that Province.

"The attachment to Her Majesty's Person and Government, evinced by both branches of the Legislature of New Brunswick, and their unanimous condemnation of the late treasonable attempts in Upper and Lower Canada, call for Her Majesty's sincere acknowledgments. Although the Queen has every confidence that the revolt in Lower Canada has been for the present effectually repressed, and that no serious danger is to be apprehended from that small band of insurgents who at the date of the latest official intelligence were still in arms in Upper Canada, it is very gratifying to Her Majesty to perceive the zeal and gallantry with which the Legislature of New Brunswick have come forward to offer their own services, and those of the people whom they represent, to vindicate the authority of the Law in the adjacent Provinces, and to maintain the integrity of the Empire."

Whereas the Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of March and July 1837, pass sixty Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz.:

- No. 1093. "An Act for the more effectual prevention of fires within the City of Saint John."
- No. 1094. "An Act to provide for increasing the number of Constables in the City of Saint John, and for appointing special Constables in the City and County of Saint John."
- No. 1095. "An Act to amend the Act for the more effectual recovery of fines imposed upon Jurors and Officers attending the Courts of Justice in this Province."
- No. 1096. "An Act for the amendment of the Law and the better advancement of Justice."
- No. 1097. "An Act in addition to the Acts relating to the Public Registry of Deeds in this Province."

Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
