Sir—The undersigned read with surprise in the Gleaner of the 10th inst. the report of the proceedings of "a respectable and numerous attended meeting," held in this Town on the 2d of April, in reference to the affairs of Mr. Leggett, in which your conduct is severely censured.

From the ingenious manner in which those proceedings are published, we must conclude that there appears to be a design to burden you, in the public estimation, with the reproach of all classes in this community, which we conceive to be most audacious and unjust.

Therefore, in justice to you, Sir, in vindication of our own opinions and character, and from a due regard to the dissemination of truth, we beg thus to assure you, that we know nothing of "a public meeting of the inhabitants of Bathurst," held in this place for the purpose alluded to; nor do the resolutions reported to have been adopted at such meeting convey our sentiments.
