An Address was presented to His Excellency by the inhabitants of that settlement, which received a suitable reply. His Excellency further expressed himself much pleased with the improved state of cultiva-Daniel Duff, Gent. to be Quarter Master tion, which was every where apparent; and by taking advantage of a lumbering road. passed through a field of wheat, to which we alluded last week, being a clearance of one hundred acres in one block; and where His Excellency was met by Mr. Blake, by whom the improvement has been made.

The party arrived at Decantlen's on the southwest Miramichi, about 30 miles below Boiestown, on the following day; and in consequence of the carriage breaking down, proceeded in canoes as far as Wilson's Point, where the Lieut. Governor was met by a party of gentlemen, who conducted him to the residence of the Hon. Joseph Cunard at Chatham. A procession of the Trades Union was then formed, headed by a band of music, which accompanied by a large concourse of the inhabitants generally, proceeded to welcome His Excellency; who came out and expressed his acknowledgements and the pleasure he felt, at beholding so numerous and respectable an assemblage of persons.

On the morning of the 26th, at day break, the steamboat having been detained by accident. His Excellency and suite embarked on board the steamer Cape Breton, that had been prepared for the occasion, and started for Dalhousie on the Ristigouche, which she reached at 2 o'clock on the following day, having on the passage encountered a violent gale of wind. A salute was fired on the arrival of the steamer, and His Excellency immediately proceeded to the Court House, where an address was presented; after which a site was chosen for the Court House and Jail of the recently erected County, and a lot of land was directed to be reserved for

military purposes. An application having been made for a tract called Rocky Island, His Excellency examined the place with a practised eye; Ensign J. that line of communication with Quebec. They then returned down the river, keeping on the Canada side, and passing through a large settlement of Micmac Indians; by whom the Lieut. Governor was well received, the Chiefs assembling and welcoming His Excellency's arrival. After stopping at Mr. Christie's, late member for Gaspe, the Lieut. Governor and party recrossed the river and landed at Campbelltown under a salute; after which a number of the principal inhabitants were introduced to His Excellency at Mr. Ritchie's, where the party

partook of refreshments. Again embarking on board the Cape Breton, they proceeded to Bathurst, and anchored off the Bar about 10 o'clock at night. The Lieutenant Governor landed on the morning of the 28th at an early hour, and having viewed the village and adjacent country, breakfasted with W. End, Esq., after which he proceeded to the Court House, when an address was presented. and a number of gentlemen were introduced to His Excellency; who then inspected and approved of a site for the bridge, which is about to be erected for the purpose of con-

necting Bathurst with Ste. Famille. His Excellency then crossed the River and visited Mons. Doucett, a worthy Acadian, one of the original settlers, and returned to Mr. End's, having reviewed Mr. Ferguson's establishment on the opposite side of the river. At 20'clock the party left for Chatham by land, a distance of thirty-seven miles, which they reached about 8 o'clock the same evening.

On the 30th the Lieut. Governor went to Newcastle, and met a number of persons on business, or who came to pay their respects. After receiving an address from the County of Northumberland in the County Court House, His Excellency returned to Chatham, where an Address was presented by the Mechanics of that place. After dining with the Hon.
