Whereas the Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of March 1836, pass four Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz.:

No. 1035. An Act to incorporate sundry persons by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Saint Stephen's Bank in the County of Charlotte.

No. 1059. An Act to incorporate sundry persons by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the City Bank.

No. 1060. An Act to provide for the further increase of the Capital Stock of the Bank of New Brunswick, and to amend and continue the Act for incorporating the said Bank.

No. 1061. An Act to increase the Capital Stock of the Central Bank of New Brunswick, and to amend the Act incorporating the same.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should receive Her Majesty's Royal confirmation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her Royal confirmation of the said Acts, and the same are hereby confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted accordingly: whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
