DISTRESSING OCCURRENCE.

—We have the painful duty to state, that on Sunday morning last the 15th instant, HOWARD DOUGLAS, eldest son of JOHN HAZEN, Esquire, of Sunbury, having gone to the Barn in company with his cousin, a little boy a year younger than himself, in search of eggs, and in returning, a few feet from the door, a bull struck him with his horns on the left side of his chest, which instantly caused his death. The sudden and melancholy death of this promising youth at the early age of nine years and three months, has occasioned the greatest grief to his bereaved parents, with whom we deeply sympathize in this afflictive dispensation.

WOOLSTOCK, April 14.—The New Mail Stage Line,

which is to run once a week between Fredericton and Quebec, is now in operation—it commenced running last Wednesday.

The Woodstock and Fredericton Stage Coach Company run a mail stage between Woodstock and Fredericton, and the above line is put on from this place to the Grand Falls by Mr. J. R. Tupper, as per contract from the Post Office Department, to run through in one day.

L. R. Coombes, Esq. is contractor for the route from the Grand Falls to the head of Lake Tanisquatta, and is to provide suitable accommodations for not less than three passengers and their baggage.

Mr. Jones is to take the remainder of the route to Quebec. The whole is to be performed in 5 1/2 days.—This arrangement will afford a comfortable conveyance at all seasons of the year, from Nova Scotia and N. Brunswick to the Canadas, and do away with the necessity of travelling through the U. States.—Times.

NEW YORK, April 2.—On Monday, His Excellency Sir Francis Head, sailed for England in the Cambridge.

He was accompanied down the bay, by Lord Gosford and upwards of a hundred other gentlemen, who testified their respect for him to the last moment of his being among them.

At a dinner where he was a guest, on Saturday, Sir Francis gave as a toast the health of General Scott, which he prefaced with some appropriate remarks.

Lord Gosford sails on the 10th in the Toronto for London.

During his long life, integrity and benevolence were ever conspicuous, and at the closing scene, he left this world of trial with full confidence of being received by the blessed Saviour, in Heaven.

At the same place on the 9th inst. in the 67th year of her age, Elizabeth, relict of the late Alexander

M'Leod, Esquire, after a severe and protracted affliction.—In early life, Mrs. M'Leod was the subject of the regenerating Grace of God, and ever sustained the character of a devoted follower of Christ; as a member of the visible Church, she was an ornament to the Methodist Society, to which she was united from nearly its first establishment in this Province. The Lord graciously crowned her piety and consistent life with a death eminently peaceful and happy.—"Blessed is that servant, whom the Lord cometh, shall find watching."
