KING'S COLLEGE, APRIL 10.

The terminal examination of the Students of this College was to-day; but owing to the very stormy state of the weather, few or no strangers could attend. The business began about 10 A. M. and did not conclude until past 3 o'clock. The Professor of Classics commenced by exercising his pupils in Juvenal, Xenophon, the historical works of Herodotus, and some of the more difficult choruses of Sophocles. In Mathematics the Professor examined his classes on certain subjects chosen by lot from the Elements of Euclid, Algebra, Woodhouse's plane Trigonometry, and the theory and practice of Mensuration and Surveying; after this again the young men were questioned upon the more prominent doctrines of Mental Science, and upon the history and progress of Philosophy; last of all upon Chemistry, and more particularly the useful subjects of Heat, Light and Electricity, together with their immediate applications to the progressess continually going on in nature.

A special account of the progress of each pupil was read by the several teachers, when they concluded their questioning, and at the close of the whole, the Vice President took occasion to express his satisfaction at the increasing improvement and attention displayed by the Students, and to state his willingness to concur with the favourable opinions which had just been expressed by his fellow teachers.
