York General Sessions.

JANUARY TERM, 1838.

WHEREAS in and by the third Section of an Act of the General Assembly of this Province, made and passed in the first Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to repeal all the Acts in force relating to 'Trespasses, and to make more effectual provision 'for the same,' the Justices of the Peace in their General Sessions are empowered to make such other Regulations as shall be most expedient and agreeable to the nature and circumstances of the several Counties, Towns and Parishes: And whereas it has been made to appear to this Court, that the allowing SHEEP to run at large on the Public Streets and Highways is attended with great damage and inconvenience:

Be it therefore ordered, That no Sheep be allowed to run at large on any of the Public Streets or Highways within the County of York, between the 1st May and 1st November, in each and every year, under a penalty of Sixpence for each Sheep so running at large.
