MILITIA GENERAL ORDER.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief, considering it important to render the Militia Artillery of the Province efficient and available with as little delay as possible, has been pleased to appoint Captain Richard Hayne, on the half-pay of the Royal Staff Corps, and formerly of the Royal Artillery, to be Lieutenant Colonel Commandant of the said Militia Artillery.

His Excellency has been further pleased to direct, that this Arm of the Service be increased to Ten Companies, and formed into a Regiment, entitled "The New Brunswick Regiment of Artillery;" the distribution of which to be as follows, viz.:

At Fredericton, 2 Companies.

"St. John, 2 Companies.

"St. Andrews, 1 Do.

"St. Stephens, 1 Do.

County of Westmorland, 1 Do.

County of Northumberland, 1 Do.

County of Kent, (Richibucto), 1 Do.

County of Carleton, (Woodstock), 1 Do.

Total—10 Companies.

Each Company to consist of 1 Captain, 1 First Lieutenant, 1 Second Lieutenant, 4 Non Commissioned Officers, and 32 Privates.

The Officers belonging to the Companies already formed, are to consider themselves respectively attached to the same until further orders.

The Uniform of the Corps to be Blue with Red Facings, and similar to that now worn by the Royal Artillery. The Button to be struck with Three Guns, surmounted by a Crown, and encircled by the words "New Brunswick Regiment of Artillery."

His Excellency has been pleased to accept the resignation of Captain Thomas Barlow, and to permit him to retire with the rank of Major.

Legislative Council Chamber, 9th March, 1838.

At half past one o'clock, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor came to the Council Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod was sent to command the attendance of the House of Assembly, when His Excellency closed the Session of the Legislature with the following Speech:—
