PROGRESS OF THE WAR

[April 6 to April 12] THE Western campaign, in the week under review, again witnessed the fiercest fighting.

Further to the west, in the Argonne, and to the north-west, in the Flanders and Artois sectors, fierce battles for positions were waged with varying success.

The Russian campaign in Europe was prosecuted with greater vigor in the Dvinsk sector, but no material change was reported.

The Russian campaign in Asia furnished no important news during the week. The Russians did not claim any further advances, but reported to have repelled successfully several Turkish attacks.

In the Mesopotamian campaign, on what the Turks designate as the Irbid front, the British force attempting to relieve the force beleaguered at Kut-el-Arara, succeeded in taking the strongly entrenched Turkish position at Felahie, thirteen miles below Kut-el-Arara.

No hostilities were reported in any part of the Balkans. The Austro-Italian campaign continued with the usual vigor, but no important success was achieved by either side.

News was received of a further success in German East Africa, as shown in the capture of the British garrison at Tanga, and the capture of 400 native troops and their German officers, to the north-west of Moishi.

Portugal for the first time in the war was mentioned among the belligerents. The British Government is taking the small town of Kionga on the African coast opposite Zanzibar which the Germans seized in 1904.

The week's toll of submarine victims was unusually heavy, as shown in "News of the Sea" and many lives were lost. None of the merchant vessels destroyed appear to have been armed.

Another Zeppelin raid was made on the east coast of England on the 5th of April, making the sixth raid in as many consecutive days. One person was killed and eight persons injured.

PARLIAMENT AT OTTAWA

THE business of Parliament proceeded during the past week without any sensational incident, and many bills were passed, and a large number of the items in the estimates were agreed to in Committee of Supply.

While the BEACON is not now a political paper, we regret that we have not the space available to give fuller reports of the proceedings of Parliament and of the parliamentary debates.

SIR CHARLES BROWNLOW

Field-Marshal Sir Charles Henry Brownlow, the oldest of the British Field-Marshal, Berks, England. Sir Charles was born December 12, 1831, a son of Colonel George A. Brownlow.

He served in the Funtab campaigns in 1848, the Heana campaign in 1853, the expedition against the Moundt tribes the following year, in which he was severely wounded; the Boudjar, Euzoazi expeditions, the China war in 1860, the Amoy campaign, and commanded the column in the Loosai expedition in 1871.

He was aide de camp to Queen Victoria from 1869 to 1881, and Assistant Military Secretary at Horse Guards from 1879 to 1882. G. C. B. in 1872. Sir Charles was appointed a Field-Marshal in 1908.
