Tinned Lobster

There is a good demand for Canadian tinned lobster if properly put up. Only heavily tinned plates should be used for making cans (Lobster works quickly on tin plates) the inside of which should be lined with heavy paraffin chment paper and the lobster packed thoroughly fresh. This requires large packing factories. Small factories do not as a general rule employ skilled labor and as they cannot pack as fast as supplies come in during the packing season the result is that stale or partially stale goods are packed, which go off flavor very quickly.—From agent for Dept. of agriculture in Gt. BIBLE IN BIGAMY CASE.

May Not Prove a Guide in Marriage—Criminal Case May Differ.

Precedents are familiar in courts, but there was one introduced in the Toronto Police Court at a recent session which was quite novel.

Reference to chap. 30 and 31, section 113 of that sub-section blank of the R.S.O. are familiar, but this morning the court was startled by citations from Job's wife.

John Prentiss and Mary E. Worsley were charged with bigamy, because they were wedded on Sept. 5th, 1903, while the latter had a husband living. Both are far beyond the giddy age of youth, being about fifty years of age.

"I don't think I did anything wrong," said John, and the woman looked in a manner which seemed to say "me too."

For with the lady produced a formidable looking paper which she handed to the Crown Attorney. He smiled.

"This is an order of separation," he said, "and you know, because he is the right to marry again."

"According to Deuteronomy it does," replied the man, producing his little Bible.

"I am afraid that is not in the criminal code," ventured the Magistrate. "And you know, because he is the criminal code we go by here."

It was agreed the case should stand over to a later date, but before leaving court the alleged bigamists submitted their defence as contained in a Bible marked at Deut. 24, verses 1 and 2.

"For the benefit of those who have not their Bibles handy, they are reproduced in the statute, because he is a man hath taken a wife and married her and it come to pass that she find no favor in his eyes because he has found some uncleanness in her, then let him write her a bill of divorce and give it in his hand and send her out of his house."

"And when she is departed out of his house she may go and be another man's wife."

The complainant in the case is Thos. Worsley, of Fenelon Falls, and it comes to a Toronto court by a circuitous course. Three years ago Worsley found his wife with one McFadden, and gave his wife an order of separation, as well as a third of the property and family. A third of the family represented two, shortly after she married the said John McFadden, but he died. On September 5, 1903, she again married John Prentiss, of Toronto. He comes under the statute, because he is alleged to have known that the woman he married had another husband at the time. It is alleged the children have not been properly cared for in the city, and in this way the case came to the notice of the authorities.—Telegram

MUNICIPAL OWNERSHIP.

A Valuable Legislative Committee Report on Theories and Practices.

A volume remarkable for the amount of valuable information it contains is the report on municipal trading and municipal ownership, or operation of public utilities, just issued in accordance with an order of the Legislature, passed in June last. The report is mostly given to "an epitome of the periodical and other literature produced within the last few years on the subject of the municipal or other ownership of public or quasi-public utilities." The extracts chiefly relate to water, gas, electric light and power plants, and street transportation.

The volume has been prepared by Mr. Avera Pardo, Librarian of the Legislature, at the direction of the special committee of the House, and is a monument to months of painstaking labor and research. He remains from passing judgment on the question of municipal ownership, but states that he has endeavored to utilize an equal quantity of material on each side. He adds that "it is likely enough the advocates of either side will be surprised to learn the strength of the arguments, the weight of the statistics and the depth of the feeling on the other side."

The pamphlet is gathered from theories and from practical results in Great Britain, the United States and Canada. A table of statistics respecting Ontario municipal undertakings, is a reliable record of the actual work in this Province. To this are appended several pages of interesting notes.

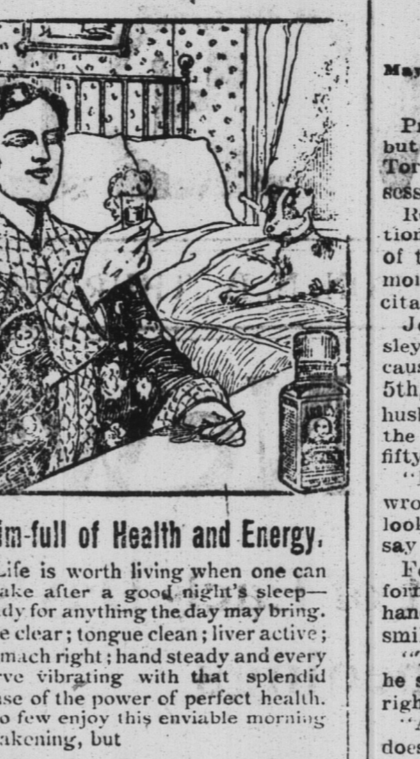
