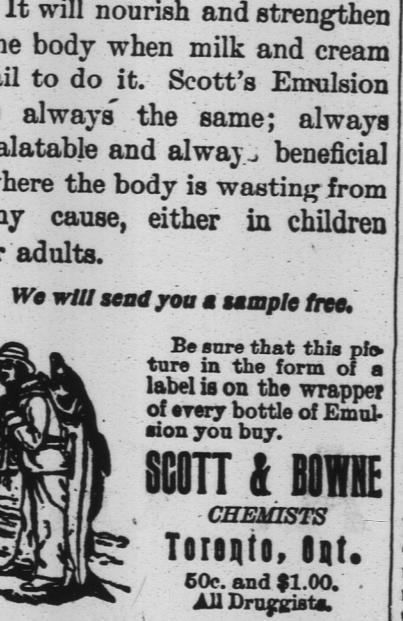

TO SEND FLOUR TO FAMINE SUFFERERS IN JAPAN

OTTAWA, Feb. 22.—The Canadian Government has purchased \$25,000 worth of wheat flour which will be shipped to Japan for the relief of the famine stricken sufferers in the northern part of that country, where the rice crop has proved a total failure. The flour has been largely purchased from Winnipeg and Portage La Prairie. It will be forwarded in cotton sacks, containing 49 pounds and enclosed in a bag of coarse jute. The sides of both bags will bear the inscription in Japanese characters Canadian wheat flour, for the special use of northeast famine suffering people, the gift of the Canadian Government. Each bag will also contain directions how to make bread and a sample of yeast to help give effect to them. The idea emanated from Hon. Mr. Fisher, Minister of Agriculture.

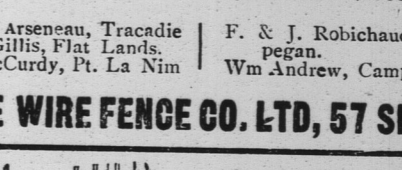
