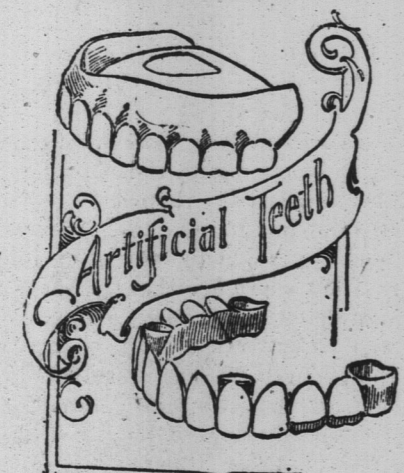

DR. PRESTON ON THE STAND Says His Treatment Was Legal

ST. JOHN, Jan. 8.—Dr. Edward A. Preston took the stand in his own behalf on Saturday afternoon and swore that he had treated Miss Edith F. Clark, but not for the purpose of bringing on an abortion.
