HUGE SWINDLE ON CANADIANS

Buenos-Ayres Firm Victimized Toronto

Toronto, Ont., May 11.—A huge swindle on Canadian manufacturers perpetrated by a Buenos Ayres firm, has come to light here. Last summer a Toronto firm received an order from Buenos Ayres for a large consignment of pianos to be shipped immediately. A draft for 90 days on the Home office in Spain, was enclosed. The Canadian manufacturers' Association was asked for a report on the Buenos Ayres firm, and in the meantime the bankers sent on the draft, which was accepted and the pianos were shipped. At the termination date of the draft the Spanish Bankers informed the Canadian shippers that the firm had not made good. In the meantime, however, the pianos were held at a foreign port awaiting developments. This brought an indignant letter from the Buenos Ayres firm declaring there should be no further business deals if such lack of confidence was displayed, but offering to take the pianos at a nominal price. Soon thereafter the freight pack to Canada the Toronto firm let the goods go sacrifice. A week ago Mr. G. M. Murray, Secy. of the G. M. A. received an enquiry from a blundering firm, regarding a Buenos Ayres concern, with a head office in Spain, which had sent in a large rush order. On referring to his files, he found the firms were identical to those which were working last year, but that the names were reversed. On investigation it was found that several firms he hid shipped large quantities of goods to the same concern and with the same result in each case. Mr. Murray thinks that the swindle is general.

BURNED TO DEATH

Ninty Miners Cut off Underground and Burned to Death

MEXICO CITY, May 13.—A fire supposed to have been started by a cigarette thrown by a miner into an abandoned drift caused the loss of 90 lives according to a special received from Torreon, Coahuila, on the Associated Press. The fire started in the Cornes shaft of the Teater mines, Verdadana, state of Durango, on Friday night. There were 107 men working in another part of the mine and only 17 of them are believed to have escaped. Thirty-five bodies have been recovered, according to the late reports but as the fire is still raging it is feared that few others impressed will be found alive. The part of the mine in which the fire originated, it is said, was extraordinarily dry, and it is believed that the man in throwing away his half-burned cigarette allowed it to drop into a bunch of waste. A blaze was the immediate result and this quickly conveyed itself to the adjoining timbering. The fire gained great headway before it was discovered.

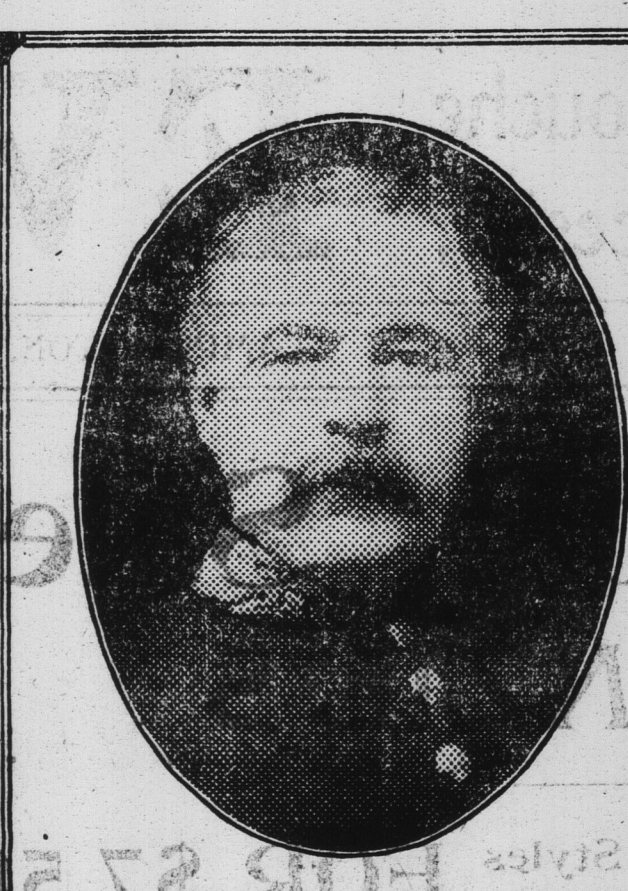
